## Le "Notule libri Posteriorum" di H. Bryggemore (fl. s. XIV)

Abstract: H. Breyggemore (or Bricmore, Brichemorus) is known as a master who taught at Oxford in the XIV<sup>th</sup> century, and in the Dictionary of National Biography, II, p. 1220) we read: «surnamed SOPHISTA, an obscure scholastic of the Fourteenth century, is stated to have lived at Oxford, and to have written commentaries on some of the works of Aristotle». Comments and treatises on the *logica vetus* and *nova* are ascribed to him in some manuscripts. In this paper we will consider some of the central point of the theory of the scientific knowledge of Aristotle faced by Bryggemore in his *Notule libri Posteriorum* handed down by the Ms. Vatican City, Biblioteca Apostolica Vaticana, Ott. lat. 1276.
